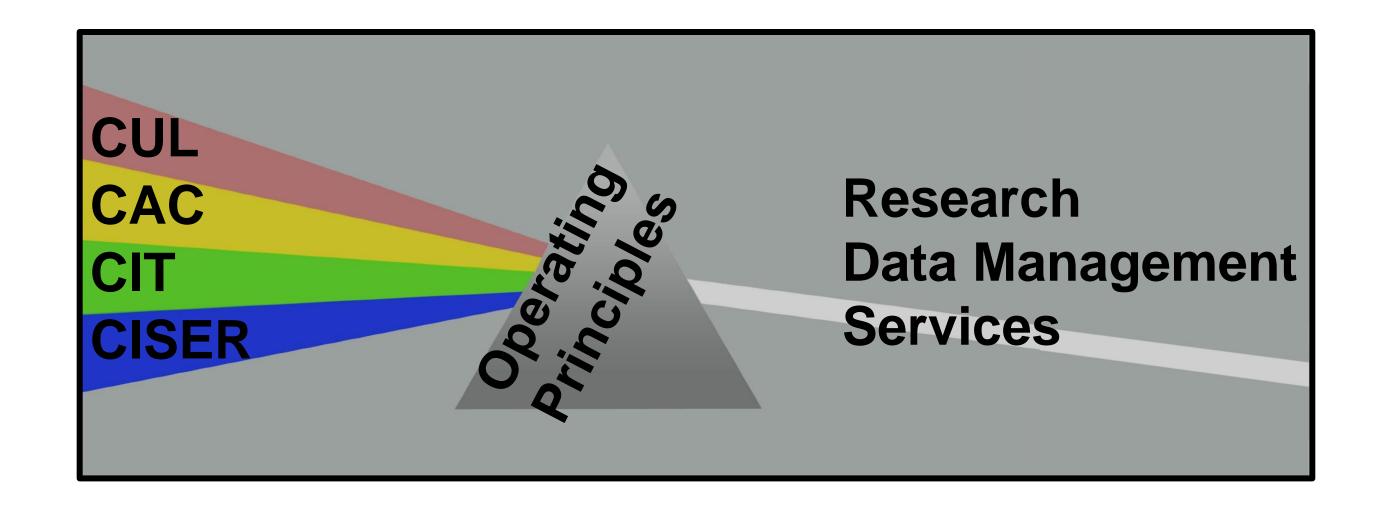

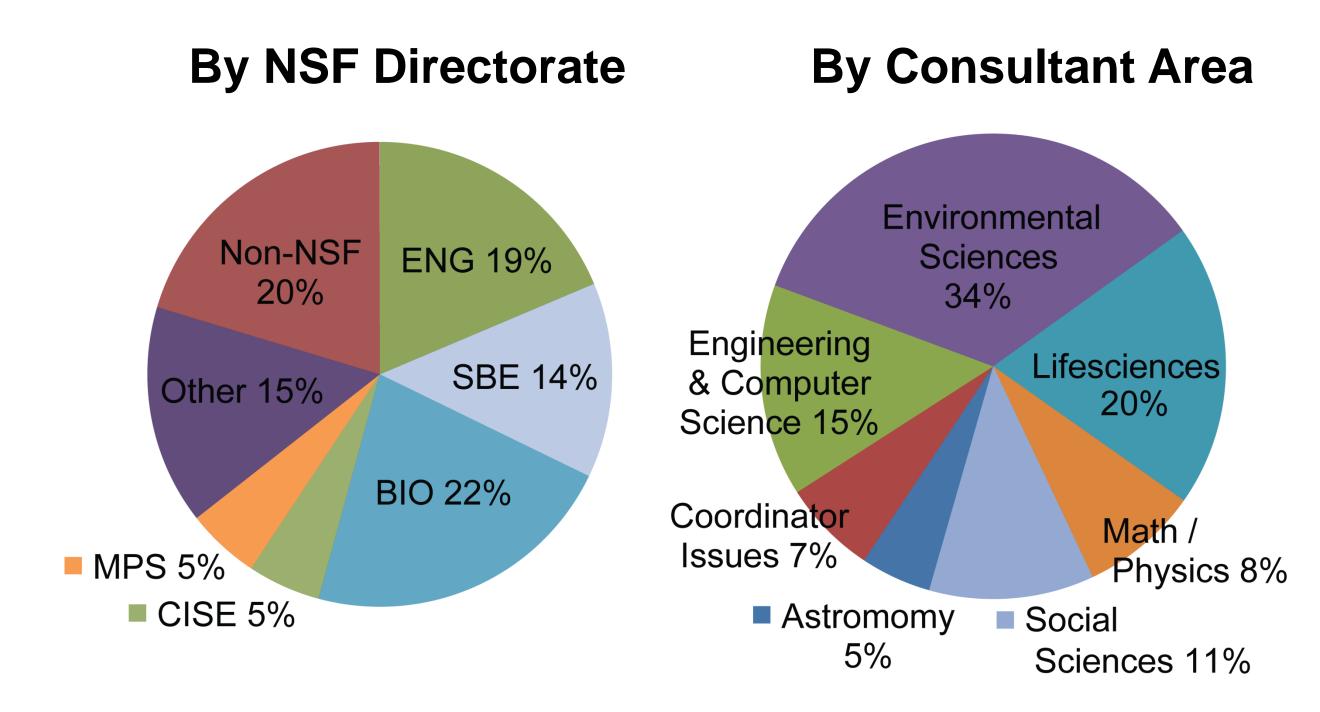

Operating Principles

RDMSG consultants strive to meet the Cornell research community's data management needs. Consultants:

- Provide timely and professional assistance
- Encourage best practices in data management
 - Promote sharing, reuse and preservation
 - Respect researcher concerns and constraints
- Share information with other RDMSG consultants to provide best possible service
 - Meet regularly
 - Maintain internal wiki
 - ♦ Treat information in grant proposals as confidential
- Refer researchers to the most appropriate services, at Cornell or elsewhere
