

The Class of 1995 wishes to thank all of the wonderful people who have helped us throughout the last four years, and we dedicate our yearbook to Dr. Alexander de Lahunta.

No member of the class of 1995 will forget the first day of class first year. It was an 8 am embryology lecture taught by none other than Dr. de Lahunta. The lecture was a typical whirl of information packed into a 50 minute time slot, but one statement made by Dr. de Lahunta stood out in many of our minds. He explained to us that from the moment we were accepted to the College of Veterinary Medicine, we were considered his colleagues. No question we would ask would ever be considered trivial or, what most of us were concerned about, "stupid." We were colleagues, and he would mold us into the best veterinarians he could.



Dr. de Lahunta never once wavered from this standpoint. He tirelessly taught lectures on embryology, anatomy, neuroanatomy, clinical neurology, and applied anatomy. He gave us access to his office 24 hours a day so that we could use his resources anytime we needed them.

Anyone who watches Dr. D at work can easily see his love and dedication to animals, to teaching, and to the veterinary profession. He has a way with animals which has amazed all of us. They seem to know they are in great hands and are very cooperative when he performs physical examinations on them.

He is committed to the education of each individual student. He will gladly explain a concept over and over again, with the same enthusiasm each time. This may seem a hardship to some, but as each student begins to grasp the concept, the excitement shows on his face, and this reveals his love of teaching. He has told members of our class that he thrives on watching his students learn.

In addition to everything he has done for his students, he has given more to the field of veterinary medicine than most of us realize. He has discovered diseases, been instrumental in abolishing some genetic diseases, and practitioners throughout the world continue to seek his advice about neurologic cases. He is considered one of the greatest veterinary neurologists of all time.

Dr. D, we will always be indebted to you for the education you have bestowed upon us thus far, and for the education we will continue to receive from you in the years ahead. The Class of 1995.












One way or another, we have all arrived together.
