Walter P. Cooke Dead

*Internationally Honored as Lawyer and
Financier—Trustee and
Loyal Alumnus*

Walter Platt Cooke '91, University Trustee and one of the most active alumni in organization and independent personal work among Cornell graduates, died on August 5 at his home in Buffalo, after an illness of some months. He had achieved prominence in many fields and was regarded as a leader especially in the financial and legal world.

Recognition of his ability at home and abroad was general. He had been president of the International Tribunal of Interpretation, which decided disputes arising between the Reparations Commission and Germany over the Dawes Plan. He had been decorated for his services by the French, Belgian, and Italian governments.

Mr. Cooke took a keen interest in the advancement of education and in the commercial life of his home city. During the War he had served as chairman of the Buffalo Liberty Loan organization during four drives, and was also on the executive committee of the Red Cross campaign, the United War Work campaign, and the advisory committee to the Capital Issues Committee. At the time of his death he was chairman of the board of the Marine Trust Company, a director of the Marine Midland Group, Inc., the Marine Trust Company of New York, and the Buffalo, Niagara & Eastern Power Corporation.

Mr. Cooke was married in 1894 to Miss May Louise Perry of Buffalo. Mrs. Cooke and two children, Mrs. Katherine Cooke Brehm and Carlton P. Cooke, survive him.

As an alumnus of Cornell, Mr. Cooke had always been loyal and active. He served in various capacities since his graduation, first on important alumni committees, then as president of the alumni association of the New York District, and as chairman of the first Buffalo campaign committee of the Cornellian Council.

In 1917 he was elected to membership on the Board of Trustees to fill a vacancy caused by the death of George C. Boldt. Mr. Cooke had proved one of the most valued members of the Board, as he attended meetings whenever possible and made personal investigations and reports of many important questions.

In 1920 he was elected president of the Cornellian Council, and after retiring from that office had been a member of the executive committee. He was also the first president of the Cornell Alumni Corporation and kept a close personal interest in its development from then on.

He was a member of the Cornell chapter of Beta Theta Pi, Phi Delta Phi, and Theta Nu Epsilon, and held memberships in the Cornell Clubs of New York, Buffalo, the Country Club of Ithaca, and the Town and Gown Club of Ithaca.

His legal affiliations included membership in the American Bar Association, the New York State Bar Association, and the Erie County Bar Association. He was president of the latter organization in 1905; manager of the Buffalo State Hospital for the Insane from 1901-1905; chairman of the board and general counsel for the Great Southern Lumber Company and the New Orleans Great Northern Railroad Company; and a director of the Buffalo General Electric Company, F. W. Woolworth Company, B. F. Keith Theaters Company, and numerous other corporations.

CADETS WIN MEDALS

Cornell R.O.T.C. cadets, in summer training at the Plattsburgh barracks, won first honors in rifle marksmanship in July and three Cornellians received individual medals.

The Lenox Lohr Medal, presented annually by Lenox Lohr '16 to the Cornell student soldier excelling in rifle marksmanship, was won by Lloyd W. Stevens '32, Auburn. Walter F. Deming, II, '32, Salem, Ohio, won a gold medal as the best drilled soldier.

Stevens also took a bronze medal for fourth place in rifle shooting in competition with all members of the infantry unit.

PRESIDENT IN SCOTLAND

President Farrand sailed for Scotland early in August for a vacation until September 20. Before he departed he attended funeral services in Buffalo for Walter P. Cooke.

Dr. Farrand had recently spent a month fishing at the St. Margaret Fishing Club in the province of Quebec, Canada. He returned from Canada July 16.

Betten Acting Dean

*Director of Resident Instruction in Agriculture
Named Temporary Successor to
the New Provost*

Dr. Cornelius Betten, Ph.D. '06, director of resident instruction in the College of Agriculture since 1923, has been named acting dean and director of the Colleges of Agriculture and Home Economics. He fills the vacancy created by the advancement of Dean Albert R. Mann '04 to the newly-created office of provost of the University. Dean Mann assumed his new duties August 1.

Dr. Betten is no stranger to the office. He served as acting dean of agriculture from 1924 to 1926, while Dean Mann was absent in Europe, and as acting dean of home economics in 1925-26. He joined the Faculty in 1915 as professor, secretary, and registrar. In 1920, he was vice-dean of resident instruction.

Dr. Betten graduated from Lake Forest in 1900 and received his M.A. degree there a year later. He studied at Cornell from 1903 to 1905, returning then to Lake Forest, where he taught biology until 1915.

Provost Mann had planned to go abroad this year as a member of the commission of appraisal of the Laymen's Foreign Missions Inquiry Commission. He was permitted to withdraw from this work upon request of President Farrand and the Trustees. Dr. Henry C. Taylor, former chief of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics of the United States Department of Agriculture, will take his place.

Dr. Betten will serve as acting dean until a permanent dean is appointed.

CHURCH COURSE PRAISED

Hearty endorsement of the annual conference for ministers, held during the Summer Session by the Department of Rural Social Organization, was given on July 29 by a group of ministers attending the meeting.

Classes were held for two weeks the latter part of July, attended by ministers of all denominations.

The Central New York Summer School of Christian Education also met at the University during July.

ATHLETICS

FOOTBALL STARTS SEPTEMBER 7

The football squad will report for fall practice, September 7, three weeks before the opening of the season on Saturday, September 26.

It is expected that approximately sixty men will be invited to report to Coach Dobie. The squad will be the same as that which drilled for four weeks during the spring.

Two changes have been made in the football schedule this year. The University of Richmond replaces Hampden-Sidney in the third game, and Alfred comes to Ithaca in November in place of Hobart. The University of Richmond last played here four seasons ago.

The principal home games this year are with Princeton and Columbia, both in October.

BLISS IN GOLF PLAY

Rodney Bliss '34, Omaha, Neb., captain of the Golf Club last year, will compete in the national amateur golf tournament at the Beverly Country Club, Chicago, beginning August 31.

Bliss qualified in district trials at Omaha last month. He holds the course record of 66 for the Country Club of Ithaca, where the Cornell golfers play their home matches.

IVES RETAINS TITLES

Charles K. Ives '32, Roxbury, retained his 100- and 400-meter swimming titles at the annual championship meet of the Adirondack A. A. U. at Lake Placid August 8.

Ives set a new record for the 100-meter swim, covering the distance in 1:05 4-5 and clipping six seconds from the previous mark. His time in the 400-meter swim was 5:58 3-5.

GOODWILLIE STARS

Eugene W. Goodwillie '27, former Cornell track captain, now a student at Oxford, won both the 100- and 200-yard dashes for Oxford-Cambridge in the international meet with Yale and Harvard at Stamford Bridge, near London, in July. Goodwillie was the only double winner.

Drs. EWING AND LUSK, OF MEDICAL COLLEGE, TO RETIRE

Dr. James Ewing, professor of pathology in the Medical College since 1899, and Dr. Graham Lusk, professor of physiology since 1909, will retire from the Faculty at the close of the next college year.

Dr. Ewing will devote himself exclusively to cancer research, in which field he is a leading authority. He will be succeeded by Dr. Eugene L. Opie, now professor of pathology at the University of Pennsylvania and director of laboratories of the Henry Phipps Institute for the Study, Treatment, and Prevention of Tuberculosis.

Dr. Herbert S. Gasser, professor of pharmacology in the medical school of Washington University, will succeed Dr. Lusk.

The new department of psychiatry of the college will be headed by Dr. George S. Amsden, now professor of psychiatry at the New York Post Graduate Medical School. He will be associated with Dr. William L. Russell, formerly on the staff of New York Hospital.

Dr. James M. Neill, professor of bacteriology at Vanderbilt University, has been appointed professor of bacteriology and immunology, succeeding Dr. William J. Elser. Dr. Elser, who is also director of laboratories of New York Hospital, will devote himself entirely to that division of the new medical center.

The appointments have been made far in advance to permit the new department heads to study the new laboratories now being constructed, to direct their equipment, and to plan organizations. The center is scheduled for completion in September, 1932.

GIVES FLAG TO WAR MEMORIAL

As a memorial to the late Charles F. Heyerman '99, Mrs. Heyerman has presented to the University an American flag to be flown daily from the staff of the War Memorial. The flag is twenty-two feet long and ten feet wide.

Mr. Heyerman, who died July 6, 1930, had a distinguished career as a soldier in the Spanish-American and World Wars. He served in the West Indies as a seaman in the Spanish-American War, and when the World War broke out he enlisted as a private in infantry, although he was past the age limit.

ALUMNUS DECORATED

Professor Homer A. Watt, '06, chairman of the Department of English at Washington Square College, New York University, has received the diploma and decoration of the Order of St. Sava IV by King Alexander I of Yugoslavia for his work as a member of the Serbian Educational Commission.

JUST LOOKING AROUND

LITTLE AMORY B. was an unusually disagreeable child. He had a conceited and self-satisfied crow before he could speak. He learned to strut rather than to walk. His first word was not "Ma-ma" but "Me-me." He was hated by his playmates, and even loved somewhat fitfully by his parents.

YEAR'S GIFTS COME FROM

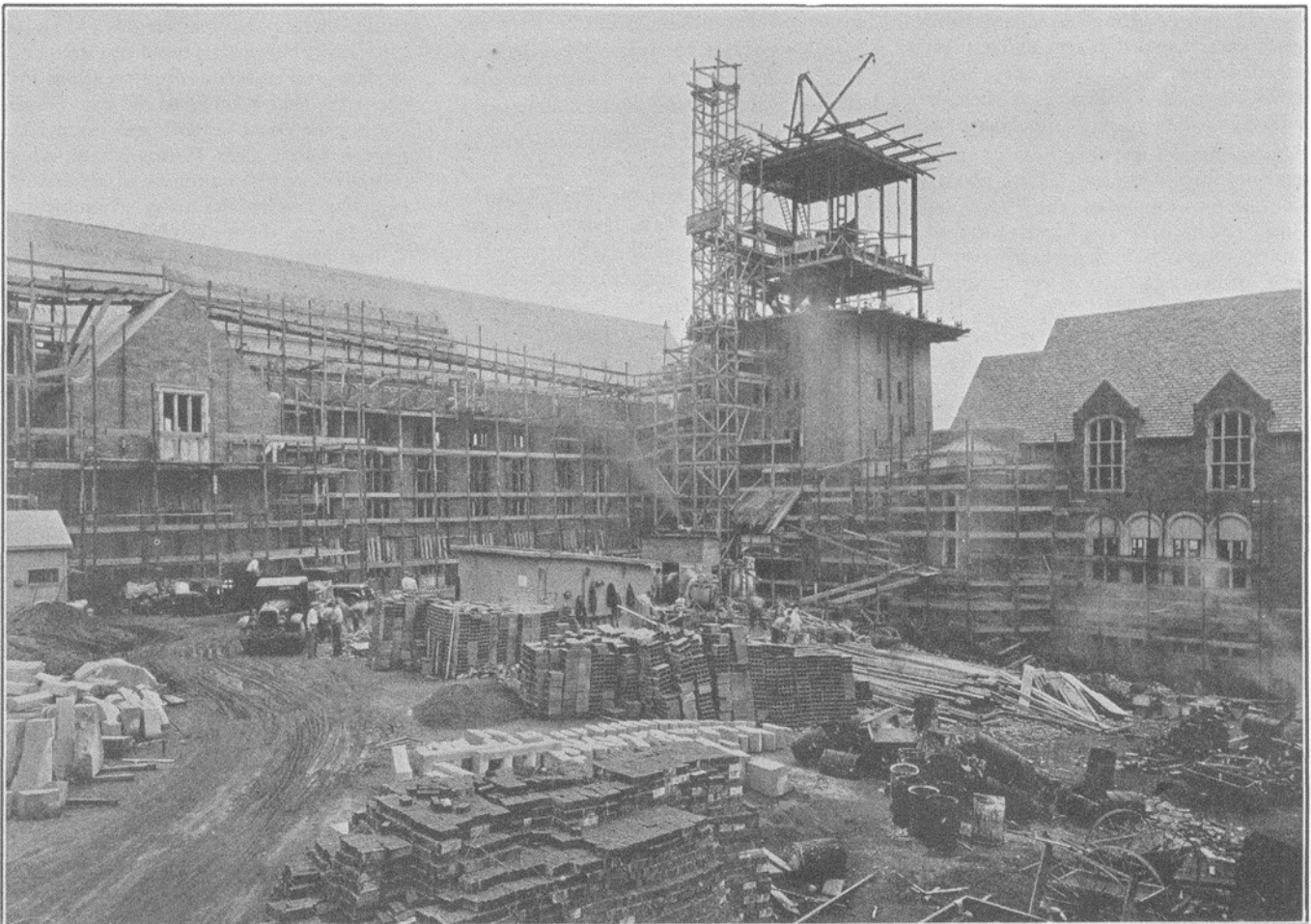
8,254 ALUMNI CONTRIBUTORS

An audit of the accounts of the Cornellian Council, completed in July, reveals that alumni contributed during the past year, without allocation of its use, \$146,051.12. The amount was contributed by 8,254 persons. The figures also reveal that Cornell still leads the collegiate field in the number of contributors.

The number of contributions, however, fell off approximately eighteen per cent from the previous year.

Apart from the unrestricted gifts, other contributions were made through the Council. The grand total of gifts for the year was \$766,039.92. Of this amount, \$396,150.56 was received from the estate of Colonel Henry W. Sackett '75, who died last year.

NEW LAW BUILDING SHOWS GREAT PROGRESS

Myron Taylor Hall now has the stone work completed on the two main wings, and the tower begins to take shape. The architecture and finish are comparable to the other newer buildings of the campus. The tower will include apartments, in the topmost of which will live the Dean. Adjacent dormitories are eventually planned for law students and Faculty.

White Gateway Remodeled

Historic Entrance to Campus Yields to Demands of Autoists—Other Improvements Noted

A radical change in the entrance to the Campus greets the eye of the alumnus who comes by automobile and enters the University grounds through the historic White Gateway. This gateway, erected in 1896 by President Andrew D. White, was not originally planned for motor traffic, and has long been not only an unexpected obstacle but a real danger. The picture on this page shows the gateway as it has stood since its erection until the past month. The picture on the opposite page shows how the Department of Buildings and Grounds has managed to preserve its entity but has made it into a real approach to the Campus and not a partial barrier.

The four large marker stones set two on each side at the base of the pillars have been dug up and set back flush with the columns. Two cars can now pass in the entrance with a good four feet to spare. The sharp curve in the roadway just inside the gate has been modified and widened, thus increasing the vision of approaching cars and lessening the danger of skidding when the pavement is snowy. Brick gutters and drain pipes have been installed, and the parking space at the end of the road eliminated, as such, but sodded and planted with shrubbery.

In addition to this work, several other improvements are taking place on the Campus. Some of the "Ostrander Elms," planted by the Class of '72 as a class memorial have been withering because of seepage from a gas main near Willard Straight Hall. They are being slowly coaxed back to health. Unsightly telegraph poles are being gradually re-

moved and the wires put into conduits under the ground. A new road is being built through the Agriculture Campus, and before Fall, better access between buildings on this part of the University will be given to pedestrians and drivers alike.

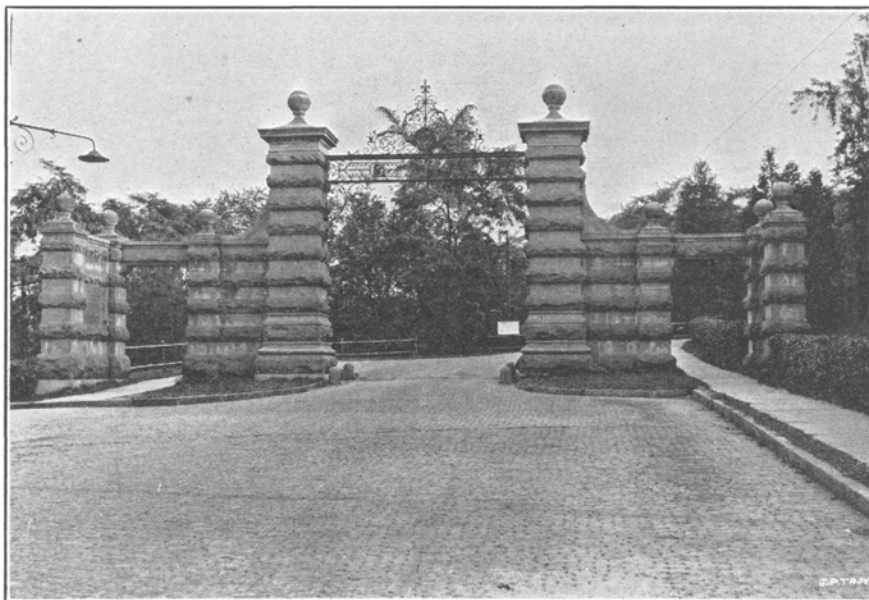
SIAMESE BOOKS PRESENTED TO UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

King Prajadhipok of Siam last month gave to the University Library a number of important Siamese books. They were presented as a memorial to the late King Phra Mongkut Klao, the king's father, and as a thank offering from the king upon his attainment of the age of sixty years.

A letter to President Farrand from the Siamese legation at Washington, explaining the purpose of the gift, follows:

"The latest edition of the translation from Bali into Siamese of the 'Phra Tripitaka,' sacred Buddhist canon and commentaries thereon, having now been completed by the Mahamongkut Academy, His Majesty the King . . . has graciously pleased to present to you a set of this work for Cornell University as a memorial in honor of His Majesty the late King Phra Mongkut Klao and for the encouragement of Orientalists in their studies of the Eastern classics.

"In addition, it has been requested by His Excellency Chao Phya Abbai Raja that a set of three volumes of the translation into Siamese of the Paramatthamanjusa Visuddhi Maggatika (Commentaries on the Visuddhi-Magga) be presented to your University with the 'Phra Tripitaka' from himself as a thank-offering on the attainment of the age of sixty years."



ONE BUGGY AT A TIME

BOOKS

TWENTY-FOUR HOURS

Twenty-four Hours. By Louis Bromfield '18. Stokes. 1930. 19.6 cm., pp. 463. Price, \$2.50.

In this tale events follow one another with the swiftness which characterizes a mystery story. There is no mystery, however, and little plot, in the usual sense of those terms. Yet the tale is filled with mystery and plotting, mystery in the sense that nothing is so mysterious as human nature, while there is no plotting so intricate as that of the human mind when turned inward upon itself.

Human nature, sophisticated and simple, brilliant and stupid, fascinating and repulsive, strong and weak; human nature in Sing Sing, in an exquisitely fitted apartment whose walls have been brought piece by piece from a one-time Cardinal's Parisian home to adorn this connoisseur's place twenty floors above East River; human nature in the sordid night club, in an exquisite French garden on the banks of the Seine.

The characters are as varied and as vivid: Old Hector Champion, rich, bored, regretful not of things done but of things undone; Savina Jerrold, old and a bit weary, but with a mind too keen and modern and understanding to allow her the peace that belongs to old age; David Melbourne, with a will and brain like tempered steel; Mrs. Wintringham, who, though born the daughter of a missionary, has known the sting of ambition; Rose Dugan, the night club singer; Tony Bruzzi, the gunman; Sir John Elsmore and Lady Elsmore, the latter returning to America after a departure under the cloud of scandal and an absence of twenty five years. These lives and many others, are all woven and interwoven into a strange and complicated pattern, or rather tangle, inextricably involving one another; back of all, the great blizzard, the heavy snow falling, the lights of the city shining rose and yellow through the snow, and St. Bart's churchyard with its great, gray tower.

MORE BOTTS TRACTORS

Earthworms in Europe: Alexander Botts Makes the Old World Tractor-Conscious. By William Hazlett Upson '14. New York. Farrar and Rinehart. 1931. 19.6 cm., pp. vi, 300. Price, \$2.00.

The racy account of the Alexander Botts family selling tractors in Europe offers many suggestions to those interested in the art of salesmanship. Nothing short of the impossible, like driving a tractor up the side of a stone wall, daunts the courage and ingenuity of Alexander and his wife, the so-called Gadget. Foreign manners and customs give them no pause; foreign languages are no obstacle, for is not Gadget an expert linguist?

Alexander sells tractors to the president of the Rheinische Hochbaukonstruktionsgesellschaft; he confers with Mussolini, cheerfully announcing himself, as he enters the sanctum sanctorum, "Hello, Benito, old horse, I certainly am pleased to meet you."

Near Chateau-Thierry Alexander and Gadget make a brilliant demonstration of their tractor, competing with an antiquated French harvester pulled by thirty horses, or rather, in this instance, stampeded by thirty horses—only to find that their prospect is not an agriculturist at all but a moving-picture producer. Being in search of something new and spectacular in harvesting methods, he is captivated by those magnificent charging horses—and buys the other harvester. In the grape country of France Botts demonstrates the efficiency of the tractor in cultivating the vineyards; for good measure he adds the hoisting of a mule from terrace to terrace, thus showing how to remove the only difficulty in the use of animals for cultivating. With grateful enthusiasm the old count explains that now he will have no need of a tractor, since he can go on using mules, which is cheaper.

Because of repeated failures to reap results, Alexander and Gadget are at length summoned home. Even this drastic treatment fails to daunt the confirmed optimist.

How victory finally crowns his efforts may be left for the reader to discover.

Andrew D. White on the Ideal University

A Letter Written in 1862, Hitherto Unpublished, Shows Why Cornell Later Drew His Interest

Syracuse,
September 1st, 1862.

Hon. Gerrit-Smith

Dear Sir

I write you on a subject which occupied your thoughts in days gone by, and to which, I hope, you may be turned again—the subject of a new University, worthy of our land and time.

To this my own earnest thinking and planning have been given for years.

As a student at two American Colleges, and at two European Universities,—and as Professor at a third American College my main aim has ever been to fit myself to help in founding and building a worthy American University.

And I have (determined) not merely to urge others to work and give;—let me state to you, in confidence, what I am prepared to give and do myself.

Within eighteen months from this date I expect that, by the settlement of my father's estate, I shall be put in possession of about three hundred thousand dollars—of which over two hundred thousand are productively invested.

The greater part of this I am anxious to devote to the work above suggested; but the whole sum would not be enough—nor half enough.

It would suffice to build and fill a magnificent University Library—or to build and equip one of the finest Observatories or Laboratories in the world; but,—expended on a whole University,—spread out to cover all the needs of all the departments, it would but give the Country one more begging institution—and of such there are too many already.

There is needed a truly great University.

First—to secure a place where the most highly prized instruction may be afforded to all—regardless of sex or color.

Secondly—to turn the current of merchantile morality which has so long swept this land.

Thirdly—to temper and restrain the current of military passion which is to sweep through the land hereafter.

Fourthly—to afford an asylum for Science—where truth shall be sought for truth's sake—where it shall not be the main purpose of the Faculty to stretch or cut Science exactly to fit "Revealed Religion."

Fifthly—to afford a center and school for a new Literature—not graceful and indifferent to wrong—but earnest,—nerved and armed to battle for the right.

Sixthly—to give a chance for instruction in Moral Philosophy, History, and Political Economy unwarping to suit present abuses in Politics and Religion.

Seventhly—to secure the rudiments, at least, of a Legal training in which Legality shall not crush Humanity.

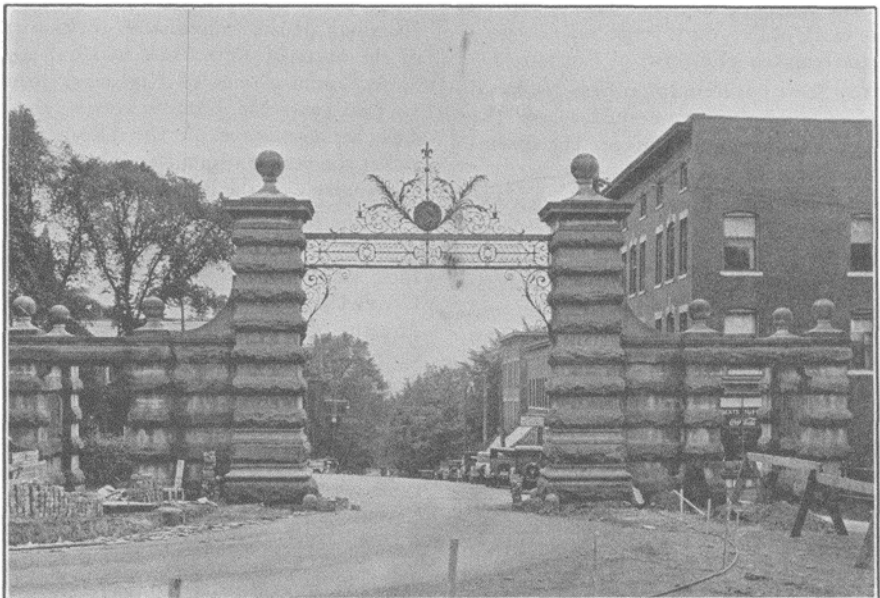
Eighthly—to modify the existing plan of education in matters of detail when it is in vain to hope improvement from the existing Universities.

Ninthly—to afford a nucleus around which liberally-minded men of learning now scattered throughout the land—comparatively purposeless and powerless,—could cluster,—making the institution a center from which ideas and men shall go forth to bless the nation during ages.

But, sir, an institution to do these things must be splendidly endowed. It must have the best of Libraries—Collections in different departments—Laboratory—Observatory—Botanical Gardens, perhaps,—Professorships—Lectureships.

If the institution is to be effective in reform it must be on such a scale as to force the public to respect it—and it must present such decidedly superior attractions that students will flock to it—despite the pulpits.

To admit women and colored persons into a petty college would do good to the individuals concerned: but to admit them to a great University would be a blessing to the whole colored race and the whole female sex,—for the

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AIRPLANE ICE FORMATION

HEATING DEVICE DEVELOPED

Another development in aviation's battle against the perils of ice formations on the wings of airplanes has come from the work of Dr. Merit Scott '20, Guggenheim research physicist, at Cornell.

Dr. Scott has found that heat produced by an airplane motor will warm the wings sufficiently to prevent the formation of ice.

The physicist was associated with Dr. William C. Geer '02 in Guggenheim Foundation experiments that resulted in the development of the rubber "overshoe," which, by periodic inflation and deflation sheds ice from the leading edges of airplane wings.

A possibility that the propeller may be heated to melt ice forming upon it has also been noted by Dr. Scott. His experiments were conducted in a refrigerating wind tunnel.

Sleet and sub-cooled water particles were driven against small model plane wings. Heat, generated at the edges, flowed backward over the wing surfaces. It was pressed down there by the rush of

air past the wings and formed a heat cushion between the surface and the freezing sleet and ice particles.

Referring to the propeller, Dr. Scott said:

"The propeller may also be protected from ice formation. This may be accomplished by conducting the hot gases to the interior of a hollow metallic propeller by a sliding valve and allowing them to discharge from exit ports near the propeller tips."

SCHOOL OFFICERS MEET

School attendance and pupil adjustment officers of New York State held a five-day conference under the auspices of the Graduate School of Education July 13-17. Problems of school attendance were discussed in informal talks and meetings.

Professors Riverda H. Jordan, Rolland M. Stewart, and Julian E. Butterworth were on the committee in charge of arrangements. Professor Butterworth welcomed the delegates. Professor Jordan spoke on "The Home and School Relations of the Attendance Department." Officials of the State Department of Education were also present.

FORMER TRUSTEE DIES

John Nelson Carlisle, Trustee of the University from 1909 to 1915, and brother of Floyd L. Carlisle '03, died on July 21 at his home in Watertown, N. Y., after an illness of several months. He was born in Preble, N. Y., on August 24, 1866, the son of William S. and Catherine Burdick Carlisle. He practiced law until a few years ago, when he became associated with his brother in water power and banking activities. He was city attorney of Watertown in 1891-2, public service commissioner of the Second District, New York, from 1910 to 1912, chairman of the Commission of Inquiry of the State of New York in 1913, and State Commissioner of Highways from 1913 to 1915. Mr. Carlisle was a candidate for Governor on the Democratic ticket the year William Randolph Hearst eventually won the nomination.

At the time of his death he was president of Northern New York Utilities, Inc., of Watertown, president of the Power Corporation of New York, and a director of the Mohawk Hudson Power Corporation, the Northeastern Power Corporation, the St. Regis Paper Company, and the Northern New York Trust Company. For fifteen years he served with the National Guard, retiring with the rank of major. His wife, Carrie Brown Carlisle, and his brother survive him.

weaker colleges would be compelled to adopt the system.

To support pure Science by a struggling college with a small endowment against the pressure of the existing colleges would be vain. Pure Science must have a stronghold—and therein can we place Agassiz and the young men whom he is rearing.

To support reforms in the existing modes of instruction a feeble college would be powerless;— but a great University—with such men as you could choose would be invincible.

My soul is in this. The offer of my fortune and life for it is not the result of any sudden whim—it is the result of years of thought and yearning for better things in our beloved country. No other bestowment seems to me to strike so deep or reach so far. None seems likely to be so long deferred if we cannot do something here.

Noble charities of the ordinary sort will always be cared for by Christians at large;— educational institutions of the ordinary sort are arising on all sides. Vassar's College endowed with 500,000 dollars for the Baptists;— the Sheffield Scientific School at New Haven with 100,000 dollars endowment for the Congregationalists;— Geneva College with over 200,000 dollars endowment from her Mr. Swift and my father—for the Episcopalians.

But who shall give for this greater purpose? Who shall establish a center of Education permeated with the true spirit of Christ;— yet unshackled? The men who are able, willing, and well inspired come rarely. Probably no one whose ideas on religion and education are so great as yours, and whose power to give is so great as yours will stand in our state during the present century.

Were my fortune larger I should begrudge you the noble fame which would come by such a foundation,—as it is, I am ready to throw in the bulk of my property and to you shall be the glory.

May I ask then if you encourage me to hope—even a little—for your leadership;—and if so may I ask for some of your thoughts and plans?

From some things wh. have been told me I am led to believe that, by independent processes of thinking, I have arrived at some theories and plans much like your own, and, should you encourage me, it would be the happiest duty of my life to exchange thoughts, and to elaborate my own proposals in view of yours.

I write in one of the darkest periods of our national history; but I remember that the great University of Leyden was founded when Holland was lying in ruins.

In the hope of living to see a true and liberal University in Eastern New York—acting with power on a regenerate nation, I am, Sir, —with great respect

THE WEEK ON THE CAMPUS

SUMMER SCHOOL is drawing to its close. After their six weeks forcing process, the students are ready to return home, their intelligences distended and tender like *foies gras*. There is little to report, fortunately; if there was any student misbehavior, it was mercifully concealed from the authorities. There is no harm in saying once more that, contrary to a popular conviction, the work done in the Summer Session is serious and thorough. In many cases, the leavening of mature persons in the courses permits more exhaustive work than in corresponding winter courses. And that in spite of the heat, which, at a daily average of 85.4 degrees, broke all July records for the fifty-three years of the Ithaca Weather Bureau. On ten days of the month the temperature was over 90. The record was 102.5, on July 2.

THE MENTAL TENSION of the summer scholars was pleasantly relaxed by the weekly organ recitals by Professor Harold D. Smith of the Department of Music, and by two piano recitals in the University Theater by Professor Andrew C. Haigh of the same Department. The Art Gallery showed paintings by Professor Walter King Stone and Kenneth L. Washburn and sculptures by Professor Harry P. Camden, all of the Department of Fine Arts. There were plenty of lectures on many subjects and in various languages. The Summer Theater put on Ibsen's "Ghosts" and "Hedda Gabler", Behrman's "Second Man," and three groups of one-actors.

THE DEATH of Walter P. Cooke '91 of Buffalo was a serious misfortune for the University. In the midst of great and important interests, which included invaluable service to the rebuilding of Europe, Mr. Cooke found time to do priceless work for Cornell, as member of the Board of Trustees from 1917 to the present, as former president of the Cornellian Council, and as first president of the Alumni Corporation. He was a great builder and a great organizer, one of those men on whose broad shoulders rests the weight of our organized civilization. At his passing many an administrator has felt a blank feeling of calamity, and wondered: "What can we do? How can we possibly get along without his strength and wisdom?"

OTHER GRIEVOUS NEWS was the report of the death of John N. Carlisle of Watertown, Trustee of the University from 1909 to 1915. John Munro '88, brother of the late Mrs. Jacob Gould Schurman, died in New York. His was the third death to occur recently in the family of

Dr. Schurman. Mrs. Schurman died last fall and George W. Schurman '93, a brother, last January. And to conclude this sorrowful record, Frank Sears McGraw '85, a member of one of the great families of Cornell's early days, and who himself joined with other members of his family recently in presenting two new bells for our chimes, given originally by his cousin, Jennie McGraw Fiske, died in Buffalo on August 7 just two days after his seventieth birthday.

NEWSY NOTES by our world-wide staff of correspondents: President and Mrs. Farrand and their daughter Louisa have sailed for Scotland for a brief vacation which should take them as far as the Shetland Islands. Dr. Farrand expects to be back on September 20. * * * Eugene Goodwillie '27, now a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford, won the 100-yard and the 220-yard dash in the track meet in which Oxford and Cambridge competed with Yale and Harvard. But in spite of Goodwillie the Americans won. * * * Professor Vladimir Karapetoff of the College of Electrical Engineering is Socialist candidate for Mayor and Ralph C. Smith '15 democratic nominee. * * * Edward K. Campbell '23, teacher in Cascadilla and candidate for an aldermanship in Ithaca, won the Harmon Award for success in overcoming the handicaps of blindness. * * * Paul K. Clymer '97 of New York is head of an enterprise for rescuing four million dollars in gold and the crown jewels of the Emperor Maximilian of Mexico from the strong room of the Merida, which sank off the Virginia Capes in 1911.
