REPORT OF THE TREASURER

To the Board of Trustees of Cornell University:

The following is a summary of operations of the 1942-43 fiscal year. The details are spread through various schedules of this report.

For accounting purposes, the University is divided into six units, to wit: (1) the Endowed Colleges at Ithaca; (2) the Medical College in New York City; (3) the State College of Agriculture; (4) the State College of Veterinary Medicine; (5) the State College of Home Economics; and (6) the State Experiment Station at Geneva, New York.

The Endowed Colleges at Ithaca, due to the large numbers of male students who left during the academic year to enter the armed services, showed an operating deficit of \$11,495.26, after setting up appropriate reserves.

Likewise the Medical College, after reserves, had an operating deficit of \$3,787.38.

The Colleges of Agriculture, Home Economics, Veterinary Medicine, and the Agricultural Experiment Station at Geneva, largely supported by State and Federal appropriations, each lived within its available income.

On its pooled endowment funds, the University earned 4.137⁷⁷. This was a slight reduction from the 4.1806% earned in the previous year. The trend is still downward.

The general rise in security prices, coupled with the improvement in the quality of our investments, brought their aggregate market values up to 97.4% of their book values. The depreciation on June 30 was \$920,243.50 or 2.6%, as compared with a depreciation of \$5,874,594.47 or about 17% for the previous year.

The budgetary rate on endowments allowed by the Finance Committee was 4.1% for the year in question. This left a balance of \$10,744.06, which was credited to the General Reserve. The Income Stabilization account is unchanged at \$101,362.34. The budgetary rate set by the Finance Committee for the year 1943-44 is 4%. We hope to hit it.

Gifts and donations for the year totalled \$1,139,846.05. These are listed in detail on page 180. They compare with \$2,041,513.67 last year. Of these gifts, \$430,064.58 were added to endowments, and \$125,218.95 were placed among our non-endowed funds. The Alumni Fund Council produced the largest unrestricted total of gifts in its history or that of its predecessor, the Cornelian Council—thanks to the fine work of Mr. Walter C. Heasley and his associates.

The Treasurer also takes this opportunity to record the University's appreciation for the services rendered in this office by Professor

Donald English, Professor of Economics and Accounting, who gave practically all his time this summer, and is still giving all his spare time, in helping carry the largely increased volume of work occasioned by the war and the accelerated three term teaching program.

Following the detailed financial schedules are the reports of the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds, Manager of Purchases, Manager of Residential Halls, and the Comstock Publishing Company.

ACCOUNTANTS' CERTIFICATE

Board of Trustees of Cornell University:

We have examined the balance sheet of Cornell University as of June 30, 1943, the related statements of income and expenditures for the year ended that date, and the supplemental schedules pertaining to such financial statements, have reviewed the accounting procedures of the University, and have examined its accounting records and other evidence in support of such financial statements. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards applicable in the circumstances and included all auditing procedures we considered necessary, which procedures were applied by tests to the extent we deemed appropriate in view of the system of internal control.

The book value of investments generally represents cost, or market value at date of acquisition in the case of investments acquired by gift. Effective March 1, 1941 provision has been made for amortization of bond premiums on a straight-line basis, no specific provision therefor having previously been made; provision has been made for depreciation of only certain of the real estate investments; however, two per cent of the net income on investments has been set aside to provide for investment losses.

The plant assets of the State Colleges as shown on the accompanying balance sheet are in the custody and control of the University, but ownership thereof is vested in the State of New York.

In our opinion, subject to the explanations in the two preceding paragraphs, the accompanying balance sheet and related statements of income and expenditures and supplemental schedules fairly present the financial condition of the University at June 30, 1943 and the results of its operations for the year ended that date, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles and practices applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

The Income and Expense of the Athletic Association are not included in summaries of University Income and Expense. Details will be found in Schedule 42.

In subdivision A, which for accounting purposes may be termed the University, are included many general items of income and expense which inure to the benefit in a varying degree of the five other divisions, or to the use and benefit of the students registered in the colleges constituting these divisions. Some such items are the expense of the general administrative offices, the library, the infirmary, the residential halls, the upkeep of the campus and playgrounds, and the departments of music, hygiene, military, and physical training.



The new whitewatch service has suffered due to both lack and character of permanent coverage. Some buildings are not regularly visited by nightwatchmen.

Practically no additions have been made to the campus master key system, the only work being to maintain our present system and keep records on additional keys issued.

During the past year, there have been several changes of emphasis in the work. Because of the extra office work required by the student "no-car" rule, the Department spent as much extra help in the first three months of the year 1942-43 as it has previously spent in an entire fiscal year. Finally, due to the unusual increase and the shortage, the extra work necessary was lessened until now a little over a hundred cars registered as approximately 1300 students park their cars at the campus parking areas.

During the summer of 1943, its personnel has been short by four watermen and one patrolman on the Lower Campus most of the time; and during the calendar year of the same period, the Lower Campus was unable to furnish the services of its regular watermen for 100 days.

This Department has charge of traffic, parking, police, fire, and other public safety services. It is responsible for maintaining the physical plant, supervising maintenance, and managing the financial affairs of the University. The Department also oversees the operation of the University's transportation system, including the shuttle bus service and the University's parking facilities.

CAMPUS PATROL

The SAVAGE Department, operated by the custodian personnel, had a gross cash business of \$3,531.72. Two sets of scrap iron drives were conducted for the benefit of other metals. This department also arranged many exchanges of needed equipment between departments.

The staff in Olin Hall. During the year two additions were made to the staff in Olin Hall. Extra labor was required in the Silley Group which lead to an stipulated overdraft of budget. The main power problem has been hard to cope with. On the Embroidered campus there were nine resignations and on the State campuses ten. Labor is more independent in spite of salary increases that have been granted.

The buildings and equipment of the departmental laboratories were in poor condition. In spite of handicaps the staff has done a fair job of maintaining our buildings. During the year two additions were made to the buildings every fall. It is estimated that some of the buildings were peculiar type of use. It is conceivable to estimate that some of the buildings were double decked. Many exchanges of needed equipment were made between the departments.

CARE OF BUILDINGS

The following is the report of the Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds for the year 1942-43.

The work of the department during the past year has been more or less a repetition of the year 1941-42 as far as war work was concerned. No improvements have been possible other than those pertaining to the war effort and major repairs have been confined to work not involving critical materials. Painting and masonry work have been stressed.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

REPAIRS TO BUILDINGS

With the university continually becoming more and more involved as a military institution, Barton Hall has been chosen as the centre of Army activities. This has placed the building in more or less constant use both by the Military and Physical Education departments with the result that funds for its operation may be far from adequate during the coming year.

During the year 1942-43, a decided increase was noted in the consumption of all utilities. Two other jobs, one of them authorized as a special repair item by the Legislature for the year 1942-43 in the amount of \$900.00 for the painting of the roof on the wings of James Law Hall and the other for the completion of the metal framework for the roof of Moree Laboratory started in 1941-42, were both carried through to completion.

The usual repair work authorized by the Department throughout the year taken care of in the usual manner by this department throughout the year.

Work along the usual lines has been done during the past year to keep the building in as good a state of repair as possible. Further exterior painting has been done, a continuation of the waterproofing of masonry joints started the year before, the areas away have been prepared as well as quite a considerable amount of interior painting.

A change in the fiscal year for all State Colleges was investigated from July 1 to July 1 in the fiscal year 1942-43. This has brought about many changes in procedure and has necessitated operation data to be shown on a nine month basis instead of the full year.

General maintenance and upkeep has been carried for as well as possible with reduced budget allowances. Cromstock and Caldwell Halls, Wm. This has been caused mainly by the more satisfactory water conditions.

There is an increase of 11% in the consumption of electric energy during the past year over 1941-42. This condition may largely be attributed to the extent and type of use of our buildings by the Army and Navy personnel.

The total output of the two Hydro Electric and the Steam Electric plants plus 122,900 KWH purchased from the New York State Electric and Gas Corporation has been 8,018,000 KWH. Of this amount 3,640,000 KWH has been furnished to the Electric and Gas Corporation, leaving a balance of 4,378,000 KWH which with the line loss of 361,463 KWH or 8.2% deducted shows a net total consumption of 4,016,537 KWH for the year 1942-43.

The total generated by the two Hydro Electric and Steam Electric plants has been 7,895,100 KWH.



REPORT OF THE MANAGER OF PURCHASES

To the Treasurer:

During the past fiscal year there have been many changes in the activities of the Purchasing Department due to war time conditions, due mainly to the influx of Army and Navy personnel for specialized training and to the increasing war time control of commodities and prices.

While War Production Board regulations have made it essential to anticipate needs far in advance, rapid changes of decision in regard to training programs have necessitated procurement on very short notice. This anomalous situation has, of necessity, resulted in disappointments and delays and has made the task of providing facilities for the Army and Navy men most difficult.

One of the most serious difficulties affecting the efficient operation of the Purchasing Department and the service departments under its management has been that of loss of personnel. All through the Purchasing Department organization members of the staff have left for other positions in war industries and for service in the armed forces leaving many gaps which have been very difficult to fill. A long period of training is essential for employees in the office and in the store-rooms, and experience in procedures and familiarity with University departments, stock items, and procedures require fairly long periods of service before such members of the staff can accept responsibility and perform their tasks without careful and detailed supervision. In order to function at all it has been necessary to employ inexperienced help and to use a great deal of the time of those remaining to teach and supervise the new employees.

The restrictive and regulatory orders issued by the War Production Board cover such a wide variety and classification of items that constant vigilance is necessary in order to procure the essential needs of the University. Industrial establishments, concentrating on relatively few products and needing a limited number of raw materials, can familiarize themselves with the limitations and allocations set up for war control, but with the almost unlimited variety of items required by a large University there seem to be few of the thousands of such restrictive orders which do not in some way apply to our procurement.

At the beginning of this fiscal year the writer was in Washington on leave of absence with the War Production Board but returned the early part of October, retaining a consulting status requiring only monthly trips to Washington in connection with the work being done in the School and College Section of the Government Division. Mr. Jordon, acting as Manager of Purchases during the writer's absence, left for Officer's Candidate School on April 27, 1943, with station at Camp Wheeler, Georgia. On June 16, 1943, Mr. Reynolds Metz joined the staff of the Purchasing Department and has been handling the details connected with the purchase of textbooks and other supplies for the ASTP and V-12 units assigned here at the University for training.

During the year several construction projects connected with the war effort have been undertaken. One of the largest of these is the Navy Mess Hall which now has a capacity for feeding some 2700 men. Another is the Diesel Engine Laboratory located south of Olin Hall and also in the old Heating Plant. This project has been supplemented from time to time as additional facilities were required. Projects have also been necessary for the alteration and remodeling of 28 buildings, mostly fraternities, for the purpose of housing students in the Navy programs and for similar reconditioning of additional buildings for Army housing. Additional projects have covered alterations and remodeling necessary in Willard Straight Hall to provide for messing facilities for the Army, expansion of facilities in the Food Storage Plant at East Ithaca, alterations and remodeling of the Steam

Engineering Laboratory, and an expansion of the Clinic for medical treatment of students on the campus.

The total volume of expenditures handled through the Purchasing Department during the fiscal year amounted to \$1,316,719.41. This amount is a reduction over the previous year of about \$600,000, a large part of which was due to the equipment purchased for Olin Hall and the High Tension Laboratory, but represents a small increase over all other years in total expenditure. The average expenditure per order issued amounted this last year to \$73.60. This figure is also somewhat lower than the previous year due in a large degree to restrictions on inventory necessitating a larger number of small purchases and the elimination of heavy purchases for stock.

The dollar volume of issues from College Stores amounted to \$235,197.00, which is a lower figure than that of the last 2 years. War time restrictions no longer permit the manufacture of many items which previously made up a large volume of Stores issues such as metal office furniture, fixtures, and appliances, the manufacture of which is restricted by the War Production Board. The reduction is also due to drastic restrictions on construction which has reduced the use of lumber and other building materials. The restrictions on inventory and the difficulty connected with obtaining preference ratings has resulted in a smaller number of items carried in stock, and a consequent reduction in stockroom inventory. The inventory as of July 1, 1943, in College Stores amounted to a little over \$90,000 as against the figure of \$116,000 of July 1, 1942.

The Chemical Stores issues for the fiscal year amount to \$38,493.28, which figure shows very little change over recent years. There are many problems due to war time regulations which make it difficult to maintain stores of chemicals, chemical glassware and supplies in Chemical Stores, and it has been necessary to effect substitutes for a large variety of critical materials no longer obtainable.

The volume of issues from the University Print Shop amounted to \$31,649.79, which represents approximately the average issues of the past 2 years. The principle difficulties connected with the operation of the Print Shop are those involving personnel and the procurement of supplies. Paper deliveries are very slow and changes in specifications in accordance with the conservation program of the War Production Board have made necessary many substitutions for our previous standards. Such changes have been anticipated far enough in advance so that no serious deficiencies have developed in supplying the needs of the various University Departments. The outlook for the coming year is for still further restrictions and substitutions and every effort is being made to anticipate these and reduce the effect to a minimum.

The typewriter division issues decreased from \$12,286.96 to \$10,524.28 during this fiscal year. This is due largely to the restrictions on the purchase of new office machinery, typewriters, dictaphones, mimeographs, adding and calculating machines, and the volume of business represents almost entirely the amount of servicing and repair on existing equipment in order to maintain it in satisfactory condition for the duration. During the year a complete inventory of all typewriters in the University has been made and approximately 30 machines have been turned in to the Government in response to an appeal for typewriters needed by the armed services. The conditioning and transfer of these typewriters has been handled by this division. The importance and value of this typewriter repair unit is more apparent as the war restrictions increase and the impossibility of obtaining any equipment continues.

The University messenger service has been of increasing value with the necessity for prompt and dependable delivery of campus mail to and from the Army and Navy offices.

The relationship between the Purchasing Department and the various New York State departments in Albany has continued to be cordial and cooperative, and the many details involved in such contacts have been handled expeditiously.

The Purchasing Department has benefited greatly from its association contacts with the National Association of Purchasing Agents and the Educational Buyers Association. The latter, through its affiliate the Educational and Institutional Cooperative Service, has been of great value in handling some of the procure-

ment problems in connection with equipment needed for dormitories and mess halls for the Army and Navy training programs much of which was required on short notice. Very substantial savings have been made in taking advantage of several of the contracts available for use by members. The very excellent informational service in the Bulletin of the NAPA has done much to supply prompt interpretations of War Production Board orders and clarify complex procedures.



The Naval officers taking the Diesel Course are housed in Sage College. The maximum number housed there at one time is 250. From July 1 to September 10 these men obtained their meals in the Sage College dining room. After that date they moved to the Navy Mess Hall.

During July and August 1942 Baker Tower, North Baker, Boldt Tower, Boldt Hall, Cascadilla Hall, and Sheldon Court were used to house Naval trainees. These men obtained their meals in Willard Straight Hall.

During the summer term of 1942 War Memorial, Lyon, McFaddin, and Mennen Halls, also several of the cottages were used to house civilian students. The fall term opened with civilian students in these halls. On October 30 the civilian students moved from the War Memorial Group to make room for Naval trainees. The students from these buildings were housed at Cascadilla Hall, fraternities, or in private rooming houses.

In March 1943 the Army asked for the use of Cascadilla Hall for trainees. The building was promptly made ready for use for April 1. Their new trainees arrived in June.

The graduate students at 15 South Avenue moved from their quarters in April, making room for additional Pilot Training men who arrived early in May. The house at 102 West Avenue, adjacent to 15 South Avenue, was occupied by a Pilot Training group September 15, 1942.

The houses at 516 University Avenue and 601 Stewart Avenue were occupied by civilian students until the close of the college year in May.

The houses at 102 West Avenue and 103 McGraw Place were remodelled to house men.

The following houses were remodelled to accommodate women students:

The dining room in Sage College was taken back to use for women students. The rooms opposite the dining room were remodelled as a reception room, the students using the north entrance. This part of the dormitory was turned back to the Navy June 1. Part of the equipment from the Sage kitchen has been used at the Navy Mess Hall. The remainder of the kitchen equipment, the tables, chairs, dishes, silver, etc., will be used in the dining rooms in the houses on Thurston Avenue to be occupied by women students November 1.

The University has leased the following houses for women:

534 and 410 Thurston Avenue were occupied for the six week Summer Session.

On February 10 Anna Comstock House was taken over to house Cadettes from the Curtiss Wright Company. These students have their meals at Risley dining room. The Cornell students from Anna Comstock were moved to Balch and Risley Halls.

In Risley Hall all the dining room tables were refinished, making it possible to dispense with linen table clothes. On May 23 we changed to cafeteria service in Risley for the summer. Balch shifted to cafeteria service at the beginning of the summer term. This style of service will probably continue for the duration.

The Navy Mess Hall was opened Thursday noon, September 10. The original plan called for the feeding of 500 men. The plans were changed after the building was started and revamped to take care of 1,000, the number we fed September 10.

A second wing was built, the present wing lengthened, the kitchen remodelled, and additional equipment added to take care of 2,600 people. The construction and remodelling was carried on in May and June while we were preparing food and serving between 800 and 1,000 men. The confusion and extra work during this period caused almost insurmountable problems.


During the college year 176 women students were regularly employed in the dining rooms. Fifty-six men students were employed. In return the students received board. Nine women and five men students received board and room for their work. Nine men received room for their work, and five women received room.

At our East Ithaca Food Storage, part of the apple storage has been converted to a deep freeze storage to supplement the present zero storage. Additional equipment has been added to the bakery and meat cutting room. Twelve additional employees have been added to take care of the extra work necessary to furnish food for the Navy Mess and the Army Mess at Willard Straight Hall. One of these employees has to devote her entire time to the rationing problem. Two additional trucks and a station wagon have been purchased to take care of the extra carting of food, laundry, and supplies.

In June the following houses were prepared to house Navy trainees: 601 Stewart Avenue, 9 South Avenue, 516 University Avenue, and the leased house at 706 Stewart Avenue. The following houses were made ready for the Army: 2, 4, and 7 South Avenue; 5, 9, and 15 East Avenue; 3 and 5 Grove Place, and 722 University Avenue.

The problem of obtaining civilian employees for all departments has become increasingly difficult. We have had excellent cooperation from women students, and high school students during vacation periods. The above is not sufficient to meet our needs. Due to the decrease in registration of men students, there is almost none available for work. We are likely to be forced to ask for volunteer student aid during the year.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE COMSTOCK PUBLISHING COMPANY, INCORPORATED

To the Treasurer:

This has been a remarkably successful year for the Comstock Publishing Company, Inc., although the difficulties have been great because of war-time restrictions. These restrictions have limited the supply of book paper, causing a curtailment of new editions and new books. It has been difficult to secure and keep the necessary help for carrying on the business. The lack of trained help has put additional burdens on the Manager, but he has by extra labor managed to keep up the high efficiency and promptness aimed at by the Company.

The new books, Hagan's *Infectious Diseases of Domestic Animals* and Hamilton's *Mammals of the Eastern United States*, are meeting ready sale. Bishop's *Salamanders in America* will be published in October, and Matheson's *Text-book in Entomology* is expected early in 1944.

Of the revised editions, Duke's *Physiology of Domestic Animals* is largely used in civilian life, and is a standard in the Veterinary Division of the United States Army. *Conservation in the United States* by several authors, and the second revised edition of *Frogs and Toads* by A. H. & Anna Allen Wright are filling a real need in natural history literature. A new printing of the *Microscope*, 17th edition, has been necessary; Mrs. Comstock's *Handbook of Nature Study* also will require a new printing during 1944. As to the new books awaiting publication, it is hoped that paper will be available for the publication in 1944 of Kraysi's *Bacterial Cytology*, Gage's *History of Microscopy in America*, and the *History of the Comstock Publishing Company for Fifty Years*. (1893-1943). Some other proposed works seem destined to wait till peace is established in the world.

The lack of suitable material has rendered the preparation of Allen's *Bird Records* almost prohibitive and their sale may have to be relegated to the future.

For the accommodation of the Comstock Publishing Company and the University Press, the space now used in the Chalet has become so congested that the second floor and attic for offices and storage seemed to offer the needed relief, at least for the present. The family living there, therefore, vacated the rooms leaving them free for utilization by the Company and the Press.

By far the greatest change in the affairs of the Company and the Press is the resignation of the Manager, William Stanley Schaefer, Cornell 1928, to accept a position with the F. S. Croft's Publishing Company in New York City. Mr. Schaefer became thoroughly conversant with the business of the Comstock Publishing Company during his undergraduate and law work in the University by assisting in the work of the Company. On the death of Professor Comstock in 1931, he was made business manager of the Company, and in 1940 was made Manager of both the Comstock Publishing Company and the University Press.

Mr. Schaefer has carried on the business of the Company and the Press so efficiently and successfully that he has fully justified the confidence imposed in him by Professor and Mrs. Comstock, by President Farrand and President Day and by the Board of Managers. All connected with responsibility for the Company regret extremely that his service with us is to terminate. We all join, however, in the earnest hope that his success in the new field will be even greater than with us.

FOR A SCHOLARSHIP

I hereby give, devise, and bequeath to Cornell University, at Ithaca, N. Y., the sum of Dollars, the income from which sum is to be used each year in the payment of an undergraduate scholarship in said University, to be known as the scholarship.

FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE DESIGNATED BY THE TESTATOR

I hereby give, devise, and bequeath to Cornell University, at Ithaca, N. Y., the sum of Dollars to be used (or, the income from which said sum is to be used each year) for the purpose of
